Headquartered in Coraopolis, PA, RGS employs a team of wildlife biologists who work with private landowners, and government, including local, state and federal, land managers to improved their land for ruffed grouse, American woodcock and the other songbirds and wildlife that have similar requirements. In Ohio, the Gilbert Symons Chapter has been particularly active in creating new habitat at Indian Creek Wildlife Management Area, Tranquility Wildlife Management Area, and Shawnee State Forest—all in Southern Ohio.
